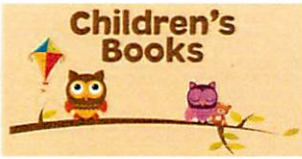

LAUNCH GATE KEY TO CHANGE

The launch gate lock will be changed on **Thursday July 1**. To avoid having a key that does not work after that, members who currently hold a launch gate key may pick up a new key and fill out the new lease beginning June 15. It Takes A Village

Two weeks ago week a young boy from this neighborhood threw one of the park volunteer-built Adirondack chairs into the water. Boys were seen climbing on the kayak racks. And 4 days later young boys were caught trying to hang on to the marina fence to sneak into the marina in broad daylight.

Then on Saturday the 22nd we were notified that someone had thrown a rock through the window on the guard shack. Also on Saturday, people noticed STOP signs turned around. This is a huge safety concern.

Please, everyone, if you see something, say something. Take a picture.

Parents, please talk to your children about proper behavior with community assets. It takes a Village to raise kids, and it is our community we ALL need to oversee. Explain there should be no climbing on the wellhouses, wanigan, sinks, etc. And, as a reminder, parents can and will be billed for damage caused by their children.

Wanted: Volunteer Coordinator

Your Board of Trustees is hoping that someone will step up to assist in planning and overseeing volunteer projects this summer. Your tasks might include recruiting volunteers, keeping track of the progress on various projects, and communicating with the Board and staff. You don't need to be the supervisor necessarily, just help to organize and report back on progress. The type of projects that could be done by volunteers include refinishing the clubhouse door, pressure-washing the wanigan (covered picnic shelter), pulling weeds around the front of the clubhouse, washing signs, painting the speed bumps and STOP at intersections, and many more. Some of these activities would only take a day. A volunteer coordinator could really make a difference in our community.
