### **Committee Round Up**

Our committees are the heart of our community. The most direct way to impact and support our community is through committee involvement. Here's an update on all the work our committees have done this last month.

#### Architecture Committee

The Architecture Committee has been meeting the 1<sup>st</sup> week of the month and has several project reviews. Any questions can be directed to the office (memberservices@carlyonbeachhoa.com).

#### Water Committee

Water Good News: We received the source approval for the new well on February 27th. Since then, we have been very busy. The maintenance crew has moved the porta potties and dumpsters outside of the sanitary control area. American Pump with the aid of our water operator John Krenik tested and flushed the new well system over a three-day period. The initial coliform tests look good. We need to submit a coliform and chlorine residual sample to DOH. Northwest Water Systems will submit a Construction Completion Report, update the Water Facilities Inventory form, and we will have well 3 online hopefully within 30 days. Meanwhile we are working with Northwest Water Systems to revise the Water System Plan that should be resubmitted soon.

Futureclear Environmental Services, our water and wastewater manager, has developed a meter reading, maintenance, and data management program we hope to have in place by early 2026. They have begun the data collection phase. Stay tuned for further developments.

#### Parks Committee

Kayak rack refurbishment is coming along. The B rack was completely torn down and rebuilt. The grounds have been cleaned and covered in fresh bark. The committee is looking into new plants for the slope from the Clubhouse down to the entrance of marina dock. Knick Knick, Barberry and native Rhododendrons have been suggested.

The inside of the clubhouse is freshly painted and has a beautiful vinyl floor. The offices and entryway will be next. Bids are being accepted to replace the badly worn front door of the office.

The Wannigan will be painted, inside and out as soon as the weather permits. The outdoor restrooms will be painted and new door hardware installed. The small park and wellhouse on Westwind and Crestridge Drives will also be painted. We are looking for volunteers to help with these painting projects!

Five fruit trees in the large park were diseased and had to be removed due to safety concerns. The committee is discussing whether to replace the trees or leave the area open for more play areas. Come to a committee and give your input!

The Easter Egg Hunt and Easter Bonnet contest are coming up on April 12<sup>th</sup> at 1:00. **Candy donations are needed for plastic eggs.** Please, no chocolate due to melting. Volunteers are needed to help stuff the eggs on April 11<sup>th</sup> at 5 pm at the Clubhouse.

#### Follow the law to help protect Southern Resident killer whales

As of Jan. 1, 2025, vessels in Washington waters <u>must stay 1,000 yards away from Southern Resident killer</u> <u>whales (SRKW)</u> at all times.

These regulations are intended to reduce vessel noise and disturbance around this <u>endangered population of orcas</u>, giving them the space they need to hunt, rest, and communicate. Underwater vessel noise — along with toxic contamination and a lack of prey — is one of the key threats to SRKW.

If a Southern Resident killer whale approaches or surfaces between 400-1,000 yards of your vessel, safely move away and out of the path of the whale at a speed of 7 knots or less. If within 400 yards of a killer whale, disengage your transmission if it is safe to do so, and wait until the whale(s) move out of the area.

WDFW recommends reeling in all fishing gear to also reduce the risk of entanglement and/or damage to gear or vessels. WDFW also recommends that boaters in paddle craft, such as kayaks, stop paddling, and that sailboats luff their sails if an orca approaches within 400 yards, if it is safe to do so.

In addition to the endangered SRKW population, Washington is also home to the Bigg's, or transient, killer whales, which are subject to a 200-yard, do-not-approach buffer zone under federal law.

Because of the difficulty telling the difference between these killer whales at long distances, WDFW encourages all boaters to treat unidentified killer whales as though they're SRKW and maintain the 1,000-yard minimum distance whenever possible.

The <u>new law</u> applies to all recreational vessels in Washington's marine waters. There are some exceptions for certain types of commercial, law enforcement, or research vessels — see our <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> for more information.

#### Report violators

If you see someone you believe is violating the new law, take photos or videos of the vessel in question, including its operator, or note any distinct colors, markings, numbers, or lettering on the vessel itself. Then you can call WDFW Enforcement at 877-933-9847, or submit a report online at the <u>Be Whale Wise website</u> or the <u>WDFW website</u>.
